

Spiritual Space Elevator

Cornerstone Christian Fellowship (West Chester, Pa) is actively searching for young men and women who believe they are called to be pastors, youth pastors, missionaries or other full-time ministry endeavors (social justice, campus ministry, economic development, etc). We have adopted a unique paradigm for finding, training, sending and planting — a paradigm that we call the space elevator. The objectives of this paradigm are:

Find Them!

Young men and women who are committed to church planting and mission endeavors that advance the Kingdom of God.

Train them!

Build it and they will come.

People are going to see the space elevator rising above the horizon.

We will train people who are willing to learn and who are called to serve.

Send them!

There are thousands of people who have great willingness and passion for the Kingdom of God. Thousands of young men and women who are willing to run the race.

Commissioning Process

Completing the internship program does *not* guarantee commissioning. Our goal is to plant churches globally. If you are called to the ministry, are willing to work with others and submit to leadership, commissioning is a strong possibility.

In order to be commissioned as a Cornerstone pastor or full-time missionary:

- [1] The student must complete an academic curriculum equivalent with a Masters of Theological Studies Degree (two year full-time) including systematic theology, NT, OT, Church History, Biblical Interpretation, Greek, Pastoral Care, Hermeneutics. This can be accomplished concurrently with the 18-24 month internship program at Cornerstone.
- [2] Must satisfactorily complete the internship program at Cornerstone (the specific program the instructors have designed for you) which includes: a weekly meeting with the mentoring team, participation in the community of faith, a practical ministry project that involves a ministry goal and leading a group of people toward that ministry goal, practical ministry training (how to conduct an elder meeting, lead a prayer vigil, prophetic preaching, working with staff, administration, mission philosophy, finances, youth ministry, children's ministry, evangelism, equipping, etc.
- [3] Must satisfy the Elders of Cornerstone concerning your training, your Christian character, doctrine, your ability to stand in difficult circumstances, your teachability, lifestyle, the practicing of the spiritual disciplines, willingness to be part of a team, ability to work with people, and ability to submit to authority in a healthy way.

We will stand with those we commission. We will help our commissioned pastors plant a Cornerstone church by supporting them in prayer, financially, with a pioneer team, etc. We will support our commissioned missionaries in similar ways. Our goal is to reach the nations with the whole gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ and advance His Kingdom through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Cornerstone holds to the following doctrine and practice:

- [1] We affirm the faith statements declared in the historical creeds of the church (the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds).
- [2] We affirm that the Bible is the inspired Word of God, fully trustworthy and authoritative for life and faith.
- [3] We are called to live the Christian life by the power of God's Holy Spirit (there is no other way) and believe that the spiritual gifts are to function in fullness for the purpose that the mission of the church to be completed.
- [4] We believe church leadership is to be elder-run, servant and plural. The elder team makes directional decisions by consensus.
- [5] We affirm the biblical truth that every believer in Christ is a priest of the Kingdom of God and that the church is to equip the saints for works of service.
- [6] We affirm the Great Commission as the missional goal of the church. We are called to proclaim the whole gospel (evangelism, justice) for the whole world (local, global).
- [7] We believe men and women are to work together as equal and complementary partners in ministry and family beneath the headship of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- [8] We are called to hold to the Word of God and allow the Holy Spirit freedom to move.
- [9] We hold to the following core values:
 - [1] To respect and value all people regardless of race, gender or age.
 - [2] To establish a culture of learning and discovery under the headship of Christ.
 - [3] To stay at the table and work hard to build and maintain relationships.

The following list constitutes the eligibility criteria for the CCF internship program. The candidate:

- [1] is a member (or planning to become a member) of Cornerstone Christian Fellowship.
- [2] believes he/she is called to full-time career in ministry and desires to be trained, ordained and sent by CCF.
- [3] demonstrates a willingness to work with the pastors and elders of CCF, and is committed to consistent participation in the life and ministry of the church (prayer vigils, worship services, Tuesday evening prayer service).
- [4] Is open to correction and teachable.
- [5] demonstrates good character and integrity.
- [6] is stable in his/her personal life (family, relationships, finances, etc) at this present time.

[7] The Cornerstone pastors and elders confirm the strong possibility of a career ministry call on the candidate's life.
